

Entering Aggregate Data into the System for California Oral Health Reporting (SCOHR)

Guide for entering Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment data into the SCOHR program. Entering data is required by July 1st of the school year.

Why enter the data?

Entering the oral health assessment data is crucial to improving children's oral health by tracking the data to determine essential interventions to help children.



Why SCOHR?

SCOHR was developed by various dental associations in collaboration with the San Joaquin Department of Education (CodeStack) to provide an inexpensive web-based means of collecting and **centralizing** all required student data to meet the AB 1433 reporting requirements.

Two Ways to Enter Aggregate Data

There are two ways to enter data into SCOHR. The first way is to enter the data manually. The second way is to upload the data.



Required Data Points

Whether you are uploading or manually entering the data, the following data points are essential.

1. Total # of students at the school who eligible for an assessment
2. Total # of students presenting proof of assessment
3. Total # of students that waived due to financial burden
4. Total # of students that waived for lack of access to a dentist
5. Total # of students that waived for non-consent by parents
6. Total # of students that did not return proof of assessment or a waiver
7. Total # of students that were found to have untreated decay
8. Total # of students that were found to have had caries experience

When manually entering the aggregate data into SCOHR, click on "Data Input" on the top of the page upon logging in. Then click on "Data Input Form". Once you reach this page, you can find the appropriate school and enter the aggregate data manually as seen in the screen shot above. Uploading the Data

If you prefer to upload the aggregate data, click on "Data Input" on the top of the page upon logging in. Then click on "Upload Data". In order to upload the excel files, the following is required. The files must be a csv file that contains 9 columns: Total_Eligible, Total_PoA, Waived_FB, Waived_ND, Waived_NC, Not_Returned, Assessed_UD, Total_CE, CDS_Code. You can view the schema by clicking on "See Schema" next to the instructions. SCOHR also includes a sample csv template that can be used.
