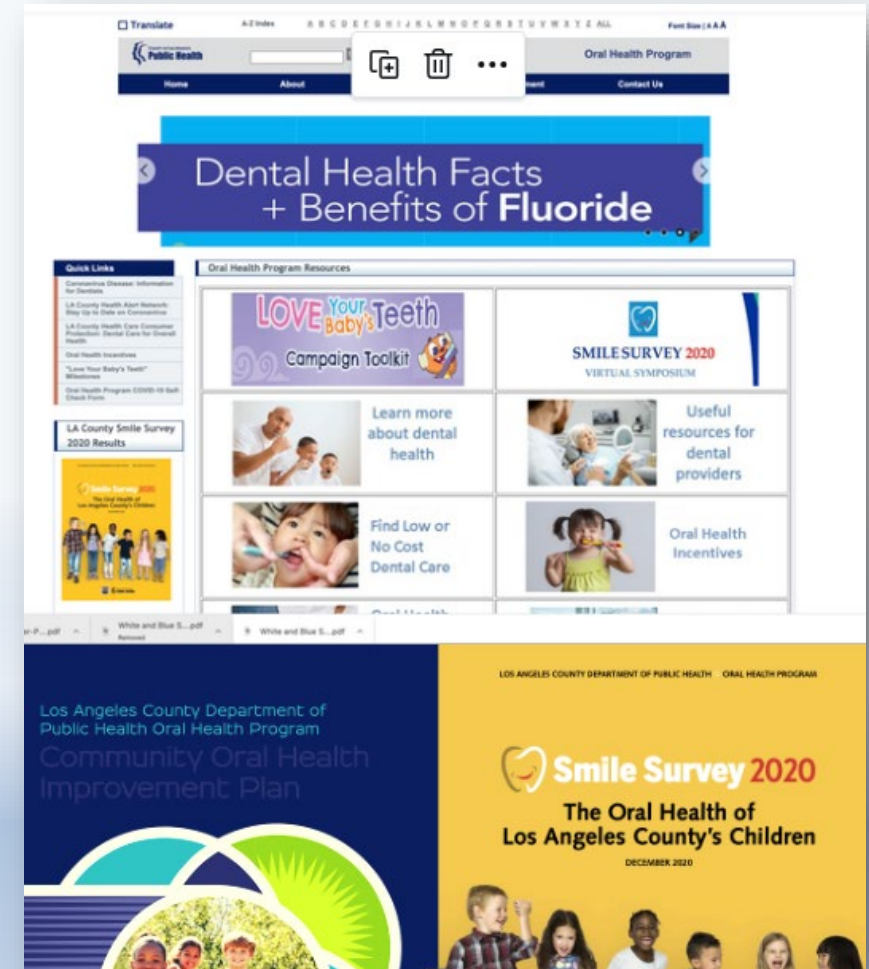
What is the purpose of OHP's website?

- Provide Angelinos with basic oral health information and resources needed to make **appropriate** health **decisions**
- Provide health practitioners, educators, and students with access to current oral health reports and toolkits



What are the main goals for the OHP's website redesign?

- Create a user-friendly website
- Create a website that is readability friendly
 - Text's presentation (e.g., font choice, spacing, colors, size, length, etc...)
 - Context (i.e., the actual words and sentences that are scribed on the page)




Why is our website redesign so important?

- Readers have limited time
- Readers often scan websites
- Want our readers to find information quickly
- Connect with our readers culturally and equitably
- We want our readers to be able to **obtain**, **process** and **understand** basic oral health information and services needed to **make** appropriate health decisions

What strategies is OHP using for website readability? (Readability Checks)

- **Readability Checks/Assessments**

- The average American is considered to have a readability level equivalent to a 7th/8th grader (12 to 14 years old).
- Tells how easy it will be for someone to read a piece of text.
- Readability score is based on the average length of sentences and words
- Flesch Reading Ease--aim for a 60+ score minimum

Health Literacy

Health literacy is the degree to which individuals have the capacity to **obtain, process, and understand** basic health information needed to make appropriate health decisions



Personal Health Literacy

Personal health literacy is the degree to which individuals have the ability to **find, understand, and use** information and services to inform health-related decisions and actions for **themselves and others.**



Oral Health Literacy

Oral health literacy (OHL) is the degree to which individuals have the capacity to **obtain, process and understand** basic **oral health information** and **services** needed to make appropriate health decisions".

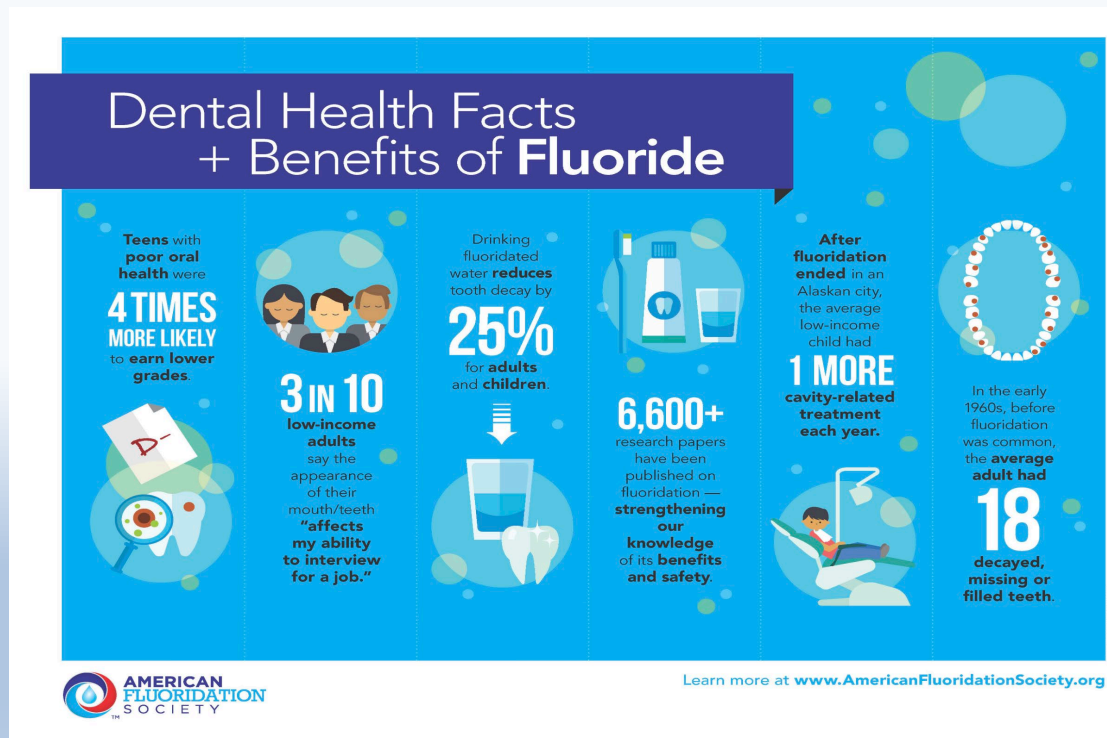


Organizational Health Literacy

Organizational health literacy is the degree to which **organizations equitably enable individuals to find, understand, and use information and services** to inform health-related decisions and actions for themselves and others.



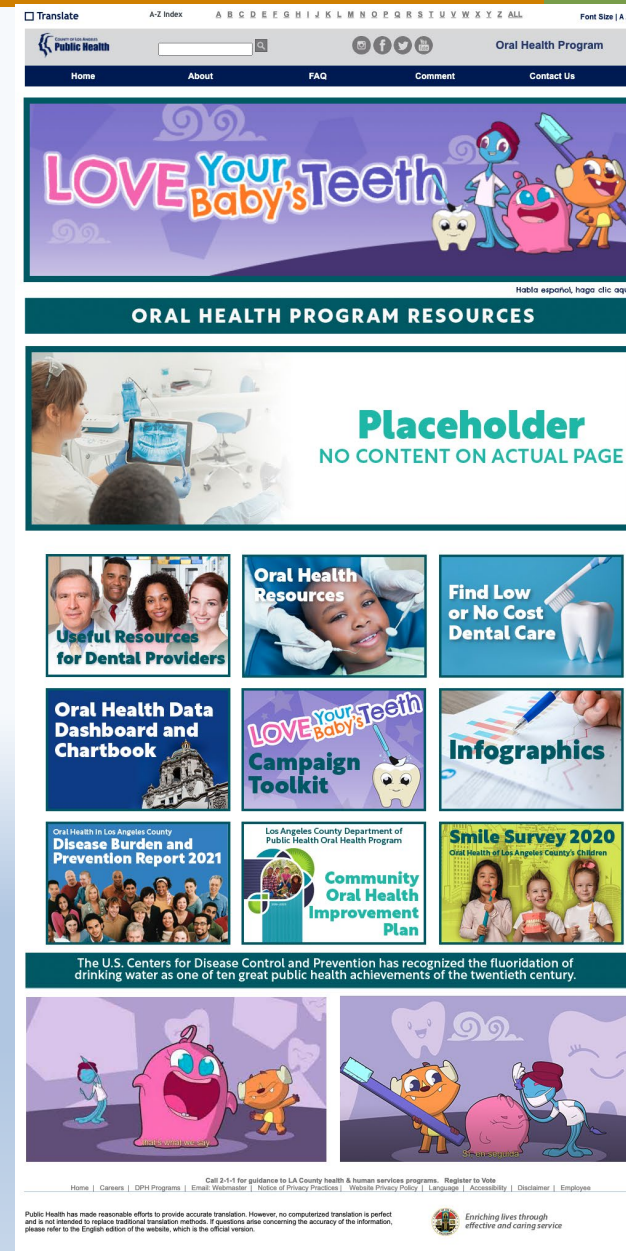

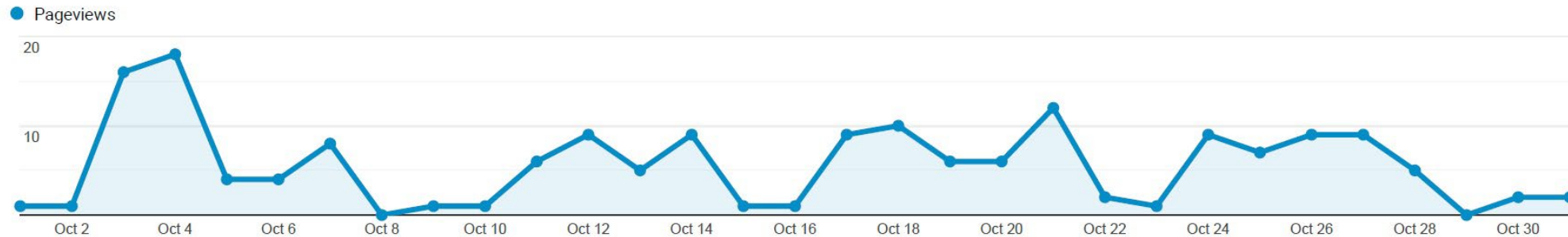

About Us:



In January 2018, Orange County received funding from the California Department of Public Health to establish a Local Oral Health Program. This new funding was made possible by the enactment of Proposition 56, the California Healthcare, Research and Prevention Tobacco Tax of 2016 that levied an additional \$2 tax on tobacco and tobacco products.

With guidance from State Oral Health Program, the Orange County Local Oral Health Program (OC-LOHP) is tasked with conducting activities at the local level

that support the California Oral Health Plan (COHP), which aims to improve the oral health of all Californians. The COHP identified 6 goals with corresponding strategies that address the complexity of oral health equity from population-based prevention interventions (including social determinants of health), dental health care delivery and payment systems alignment to the development of a surveillance system and key performance measurements.

An OC Oral Health Collaborative or Advisory Committee was established and convenes every two months to inform, advise, assist, support and advocate for the mission and vision of the LOHP. 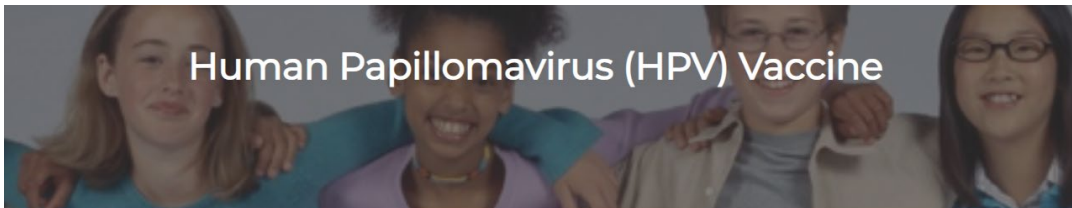

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine

The human papillomavirus, or HPV, is a common virus that can cause cancers later in life. Vaccines are available that can protect your child before they are exposed to this infection. Experts say the HPV vaccine could prevent over 90% of HPV related cancers in the United States. The CDC recommends the HPV vaccine be given routinely to all children at age 11-12 years, but can be given as early as age 9, with a "catch-up" vaccination through age 26 years. Your child's doctor or dentist may speak to you about the importance of the HPV vaccine.

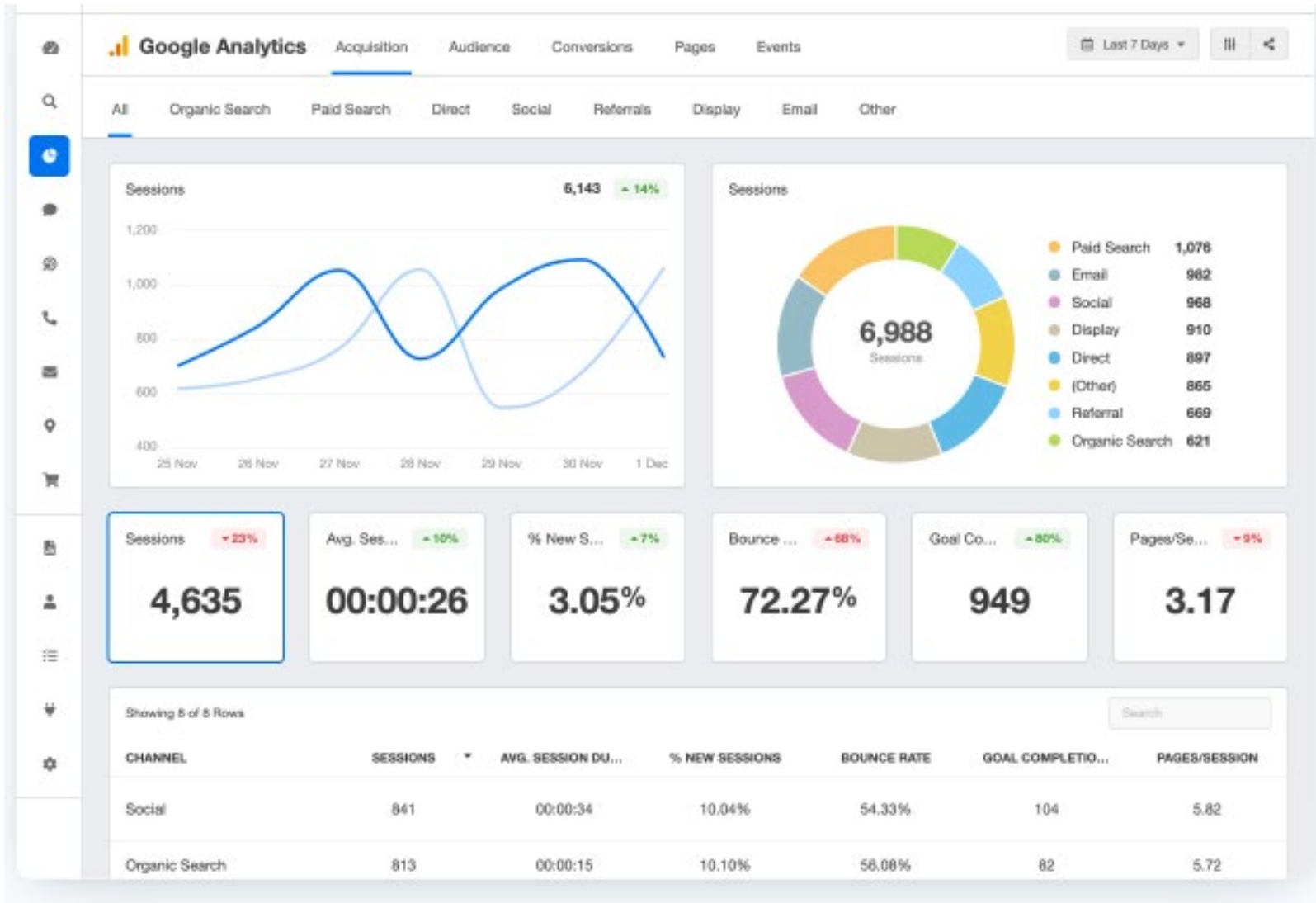

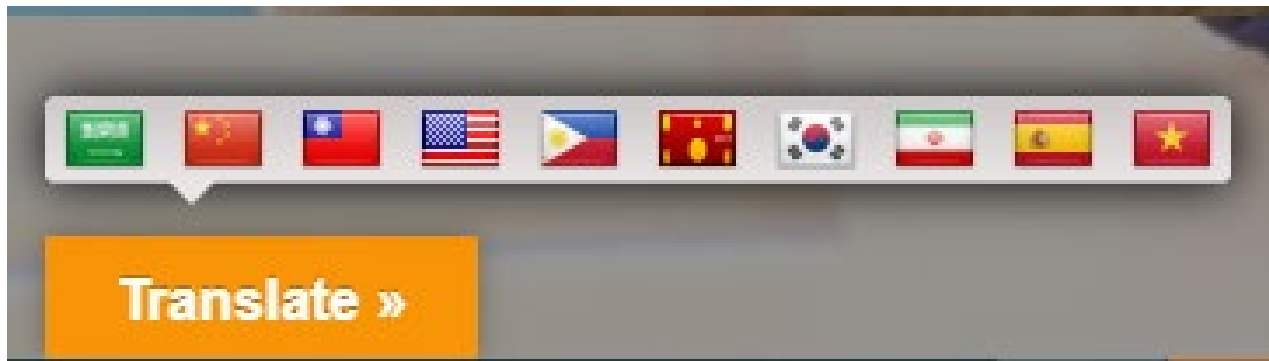

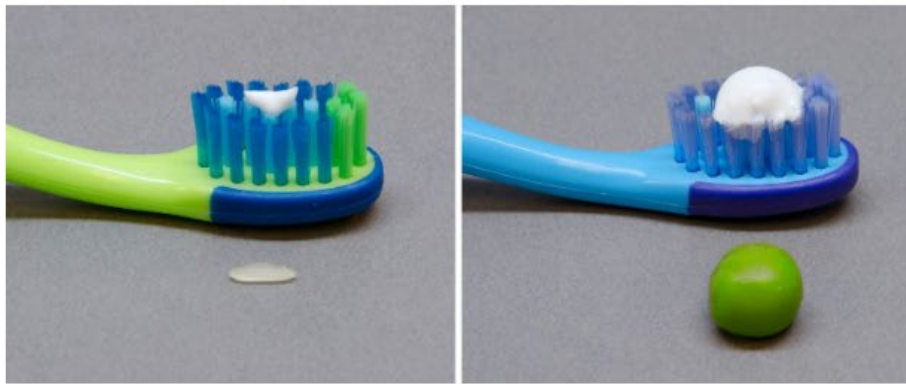

Fluoride Toothpaste

Fluoride toothpaste helps strengthen and protect teeth enamel against cavities. Start with a grain-sized amount of toothpaste that is fluoridated for children under 2 yrs. Use a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste for children 3 yrs. and older. Your child is still not old enough to brush alone, so you will need to help them brush.

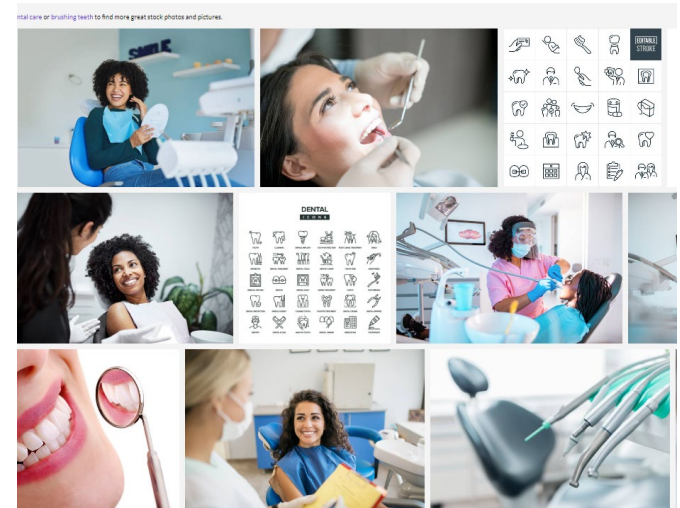
