

A Look into Children's Dental Health in California:

- 60% of children experience tooth decay by 3rd grade.*
- 1 in 5 kids have untreated cavities.*
- Approximately **300,000** children missed school due to a dental problem in 2022.**

Healthy Children Are Ready to Learn!

Oral Health and School Readiness

Establishing good dental care habits at home at a young age is important. However, home care alone is no substitute for a dental check-up. Having a dental home and seeing a dentist every six months is the best way to ensure a child remains pain-free and able to focus at school.



The Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment (KOHA)

What is the KOHA?

Definition: To make sure children are ready for school, California law requires that children have a dental assessment by May 31 in either kindergarten or first grade, whichever is their first year in public school.

Importance: A dental assessment helps identify and address dental issues early, supporting children's health and school readiness. Early intervention prevents future problems and contributes to their success in the classroom.

Medi-Cal Has Dental Covered

Medi-Cal covers dental services for **FREE** for all ages.



FREE check-ups twice a year, and sometimes more for members *under* the age of 21.



FREE check-up once a year for members 21 and *older*.

*Free check-ups every six months, and sometimes more, for members under the age of 21 and every 12 months for members 21 and older. **Permanent molar sealants are covered for kids and teens up to age 21. ***For those who qualify.

Two Ways to Help Members Find a Medi-Cal Dentist

"Find a Dentist" Tool: Direct members to <u>SmileCalifornia.org</u> or <u>SonrieCalifornia.org</u> to search for local Medi-Cal dentists.

Care Coordination Services: Inform members about personalized support to find a dentist and schedule appointments.

How to Use the "Find a Dentist" Tool

- Visit <u>SmileCalifornia.org</u> or <u>SonrieCalifornia.org</u> and select "Find a Dentist."
- 2. Click the "Provider Directory Search" link.
- 3. Enter the member's zip code.
- 4. Provide members with their top three choices using the <u>Smile Care Plan</u>.



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

AB 2630 Guidance

Adding TK to KOHA

- Proof of assessment required only once during the two-year (TK+K) timeframe
- Count TK with K in SCOHR will not report separately
- Indicate grade level on KOHA form (TK, K, or 1st)


