A sustainability plan for Oral Health Programs ensures that the benefits and impact of the program continue over time. Here are some key elements you may include:

1. **Clear Vision and Goals** – Define what sustainability means for your local oral health program and set measurable objectives to guide your efforts.
2. **Highlight Achievements** – Showcase specific successes, such as improved oral health outcomes, increased access to dental care, or enhanced community engagement.
3. **Evidence-Based Impact** – Use data and metrics to validate your successes—for example, how many individuals benefited from the program or measurable improvements in oral health indicators.
4. **Community Testimonials** – Include feedback from participants or partners who have experienced positive changes, adding a human element to your successes (i.e.: Success Stories, Photovoice, etc.).
5. **Collaborative Partnership Engagement** – Identify and involve key partners to build support and collaboration.
6. **Policy** – Local health policies should be strategically aligned with broader health frameworks.
7. **Integration into Local Infrastructure** – Embed the program into existing systems, such as healthcare networks or community organizations, to ensure continuity.
8. **Diverse Funding Sources** – Consider a mix of funding streams to reduce reliance on a single source.
9. **Capacity Building** – Train staff and partners to maintain and adapt the program as needed.

10. **Data and Evaluation** – Use data to monitor progress, demonstrate impact, and make informed decisions for continuous improvement.
11. **Scaling Successful Strategies** – Identify what worked well and consider expanding or replicating those strategies in other areas or contexts.
12. **Communication Strategy** – Develop a plan to communicate the program's value and successes to stakeholders and the community.
13. **Long-Term Planning** – Create a roadmap for sustaining the program beyond initial funding or leadership/staff changes.
