

California Smile Survey

The California Department of Public Health's (CDPH)

Office of Oral Health is conducting a statewide oral health assessment of third grade students during the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 school years. Third grade children in selected schools will receive a free two-minute dental screening by a registered dental hygienist.

The purpose of the survey is to:

- Determine the oral health status of third grade children in California (tooth decay (caries/cavities), untreated tooth decay, and dental sealants).
- Help the Office of Oral Health make informed decisions for local programs to prevent oral disease in children.

We ask you for your support in carrying out this important assessment. A lack of preventive dental care is detrimental to the quality of life of school-age children and can negatively impact school attendance and performance. Your participation in this project will contribute to the health and well-being of California's children.
