Hailing from Georgia, Travis Tramel began his career as a dental hygienist after graduating from Loma Linda University. For over ten years, he worked for a national dental corporation as a hygienist and trained over 300 hygienists on corporate processes while maintaining a holistic approach to managing disease. After practicing dental hygiene for nearly fifteen years, he returned to school to obtain a Registered Dental Hygienist in Alternative Practice (RDHAP) license, a license that allows dental hygienists to practice outside of the traditional office and bring preventative services directly to patients. Travis founded GeriSmiles Mobile Dental Hygiene Practice in 2015, a Riverside-based mobile practice that brings dental professionals into schools, health fairs, homeless shelters, and churches. Travis enjoys serving people who may be underserved and sharing messages of hope and healing through dentistry. Desiring to be a better resource for his patients, Travis recently completed graduate education in clinical Christian counseling, earning both a master's degree and a PhD. Travis plans to apply what he has learned in graduate school and in the community to promote awareness of the mental illness crisis plaguing the public school system and impacting the health of children, including their dental health.
