Partnership Between UCSF Dental Public Health Residency Program & LOHPs

- The residency program trains residents to become knowledgeable and competent Dental Public Health Specialists
- Residents are dentists with an MPH
- Residents receive hands-on experience in various aspects of Dental Public Health, including community outreach, Needs Assessment, and program planning





Example of Residency Projects Conducted in Partnership with LOHPs

- 1. **School-based programs**: Screening planning, Staff training, School nurse/dentist calibration, Data analysis, Surveillance systems, Needs Assessment, Interviews/focus groups
- 2. **Teledentistry**: To improve access to oral health care in rural areas
- 3. Building capacity in non-dental health professionals
- 4. **Data analysis**: Medi-Cal dental services utilization; Assess disparities in access to dental care
- 5. Increase dental care utilization in pregnant women
- 6. Assisting with community-based events: Give Kids a Smile Day
- 7. Implement an electronic dental referral platform to increase access to dental care
- 8. **Assessing tap water quality perceptions** and its association with tap water, bottled water, and sugar-sweetened beverages
- 10. Water professionals' opinions on continuing education on water fluoridation



Example: DPH Resident Project in Sonoma County

Problem: Disparities in **untreated decay** of kindergarteners and third-graders (Smile Survey Report, 2019)

Facts:

- School screening can increase access to dental care
- A referral system can enhance dental care utilization and reduce disparities

Resident's project goal: To implement and establish an electronic referral system to improve access to dental care and reduce disparities **Study steps:**

- Assess school nurses' knowledge about dental screening (pre-training survey)
- 2. Conduct training on Basic Screening Survey (ASTDD) and the electronic referral system (Apricot 360); Conduct post-training survey
- **3. Conduct** interviews and focus groups to identify user experience, challenges, and strategies
- **4. Analyze** the data, prepare reports, and inform other counties on implementing the electronic dental referral systems in a school setting

Law (AB 1433), 2006: Kindergarteners/First Graders dental visit requirement



Results: Establishment of the Apricot 360 referral system and Increase referral
